ABSTRACT

Running water, telegraph, telephone, gas lighting, trams and electricity. Across nineteenth and twentieth centuries, these networked infrastructures changed life of Andalusian people, connecting territories and offering new services. The Welfare State was gradually built, improving health, hygiene, safety and mobility, especially in large cities. Coordinated by Mercedes Fernández Paradas (University of Málaga), a group of six historians writes in the new number of Andalucía en la Historia about this networked infrastructures, considered as a symbol of modernity and innovation.
