

# ANDALUCÍA EN LA HISTORIA

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## ABSTRACT

The presence of large fish stocks in Andalusia has favoured the development of an important fishing and preserving activity. In pre-Roman times, as well as during the Roman Empire, a rich artisanal tradition consolidated and achieved big prestige and demand throughout the Mediterranean. Its growth, related to the development of multiple fishing techniques, during the Middle and Modern Ages, led to the foundations of an artisanal world that, once industrialized, persists today. Chroniclers, historians and anthropologists have studied this important part of our history.
