

ANDALUCÍA EN LA HISTORIA

Nº64: 1 de abril de 1939. La guerra ha terminado



ABSTRACT

Spanish Civil War started on July 18, 1936, and officially ended on April 1, 1939. During these three years, Andalusia was split in two: the western part, through which the putsch extended from the Sevillian focus; and the eastern part, loyal to the Republic until the end of the war. Afterwards, a new situation was imposed in all orders, although with significant differences between western and eastern provinces, due to the different circumstances developed during the war.

More than 8.000 people were killed in the Republican zone and over 50.000 by the francoists. In parallel to the policy of rebuilding and repair of destroyed infrastructure, a political and symbolic reconstruction was also developed by the winners. The daily life of the Andalusian population changed dramatically: hunger, imprisonment, exile... Six historians, coordinated by Prof. Encarnación Barranquero (University of Malaga), have written this new dossier of *Andalucía en la Historia*.
